Refund Policy

All request for refund must be made at least three days prior to the start of Summer School and the completed prescribed form submitted.

No refund claim will be facilitated once Summer School has begun. (Only in the cases of grave illnesses and other forms of emergencies will consideration be given. This request however can only be made in the first week of Summer School)

Care Centre Service

Please be advised that the College provides a Care Centre service from 4:30 p.m. - 6:00 p.m. during Summer School at a cost of \$500. Thereafter, this service attracts an additional charge of \$300 per hour or part thereof. This fee is payable at the point of pick up from the Care Centre each day.

Children must be collected by 4:30 p.m. If not, they will be sent to the Care Centre and the above mentioned applies.

Medical Services

The services of a nurse are available at the college for any injuries and other minor medical conditions. The college will not take responsibility for the purchase of medical prescriptions in the case of medical treatment at a doctor's office where accidents or injuries occur on the campus.

CODE OF CONDUCT

- Loitering is not allowed when Summer School ends each day.
- Children are only allowed in authorized areas. Socialising is accepted in all general spaces not in bathrooms, secluded spaces nor in areas out of bounds.
- Please mark clearly and visibly all your child(ren)/ward(s)'s belongings with their name and surname.
- A lost and found station will be set up in each School and items can be collected from the relevant coordinators.

Violation of the code of conduct includes, but is not limited to the following:

- Obstruction or disruption of College classes, business, or activities.
- Conduct in violation of College rules and regulations
